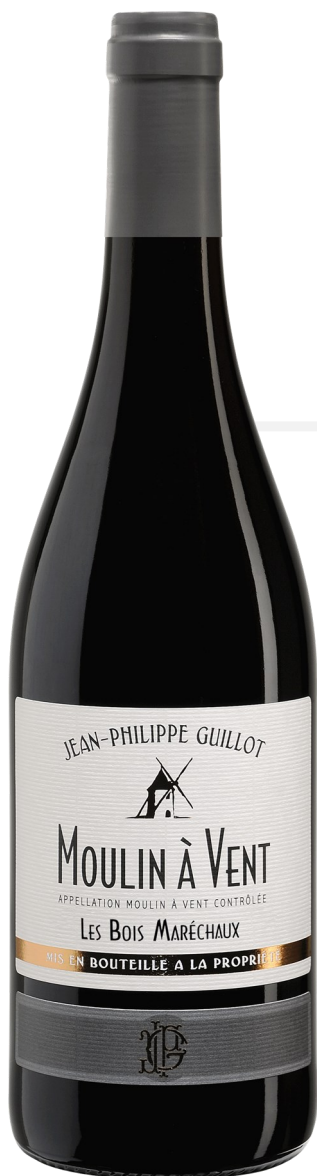


MOULIN À VENT - LES BOIS MARÉCHAUX

BEAUJOLAIS



Location :

Facing East, the vines were planted on the Climat Les Bois Maréchaux around the Gallo-Roman villas built in Romanesca (Romanèche). This Moulin à Vent is the lord of the Beaujolais, it is the one that comes closest to the great Burgundies.

Soil :

Granitic sand with manganese veins

Grape Variety :

Gamay

Color :

Red

Alcohol :

13 % vol.

Vinification :

Manual harvesting, maceration of grapes in tanks

Tasting Notes :

A dark garnet color with deep ruby. A spicy and complex nose with perfumes of faded rose and iris. In mouth, fleshy, the tannins are fine and the aromas of spices and persistent black fruits, sometimes of very ripe wild strawberry and a mineral zest.

Pairing Suggestions :

Red meat, game, meats in sauce (beef bourguignon, coq au vin), soft cheeses (munster, epoisses, camembert...).
